

Student Baptism Guide for Parents

We're so encouraged that your student is considering baptism! This is a significant moment in their walk with Jesus, and we want to come alongside you as they take this step of faith.

What Baptism Means

Baptism is an outward expression of an inward decision. When your student chooses to be baptized, they're publicly declaring that they have trusted Jesus as their Savior and are committed to following Him with their life.

Baptism doesn't save us—Jesus does—but it's a powerful way for your student to share with their friends, family, and church that they belong to Him. It's a picture of the gospel:

- Going under the water represents dying to their old life of sin.
- Coming up out of the water represents being raised to new life in Christ.

It's both a step of obedience and a celebration of what God has already done in their heart. What the Process Looks Like

1. Meet with Pastor Nick

Your student will meet with our Student Pastor, Nick Robinson, to talk about their decision to follow Jesus and share a little of their faith journey. This is a meaningful conversation where Nick will listen, ask questions, and encourage them as they prepare for baptism.

2. Schedule the Baptism

Once your student is ready, we'll schedule their baptism for our next Baptism Sunday, which happens on the 5th Sunday of the month.

3. Celebrate Together

Baptism is more than a moment—it's a milestone worth celebrating! We can't wait to rejoice with your family and our church family as your student takes this bold step of faith.
